Banned Books Week UK is a nationwide campaign for radical and rebellious readers of all ages to celebrate the freedom to read.

Between 22 - 28 September 2019, **bookshops, libraries, schools** and **publishers** will be hosting events and making noise about some of the most **sordid, subversive, sensational** and **taboo-busting** books around.

## about

Banned Books Week was initiated by the **American Library Association (ALA)** in 1980 in response to an increasing number of challenges in the US to books in schools, bookshops and libraries. **Index on Censorship** is the UK partner to the US coalition, and leads the UK coalition of literary and free expression organisations including:

# aims & objectives

The aim of Banned Books Week UK is to develop a **bold, surprising** and **imaginative** nationwide campaign that captures the imagination of a UK-wide audience, inspiring people of all ages and backgrounds to "celebrate the freedom to read" while at the same time **educating** and **informing** them about key issues relating to book **censorship** – from outright banning of books to more subtler forms of silencing, such as traditional publishing structures or taboo topics.

Banned Books Week UK is a chance for free expression advocates – **publishers, booksellers, librarians, educators, journalists, readers** – to publicly shine a light on censorship past and present, and make some noise about why we must defend the freedom to read and write.

As part of this, Banned Books Week aims to take a **global literary view** to promote unheard voices and highlight specific topics, themes or groups such as **academic freedom, BAME & LGBTQ+, disabled, female, non-Western** and other unheard voices.

## AUDIENCE

In 2019, Index aims to engage:

- **100+** independent bookshops
- **75+** library services
- **20+ state** schools
- all major and independent UK publishers

## bookshops, libraries & schools



### displays

start a conversation in your shop, classroom or library by making an eye-catching display:

- wrap censored books in yellow **warning tape**
- wrap challenged or banned books in **brown paper**, and write a label with the author, title and reason why it was banned / challenged
- create a "mugshot" **photo wall** using cardboard, posters, post-it notes and **tweet photos** of your customer, pupils or library-goers reading a banned book.

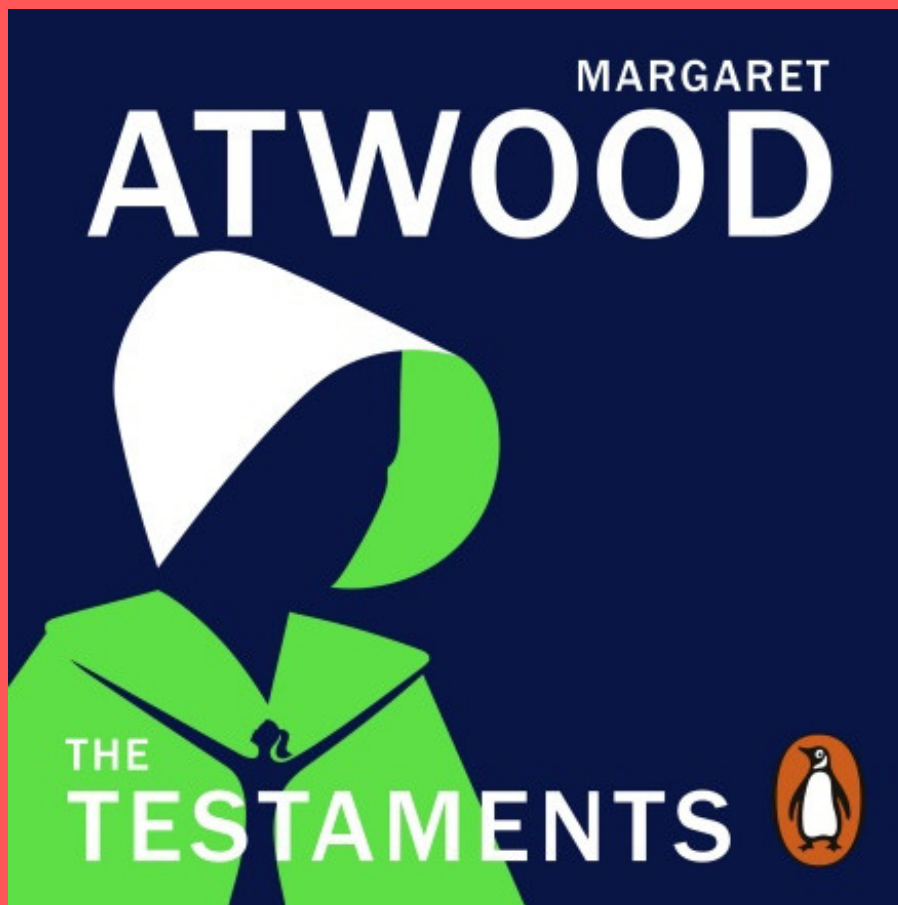

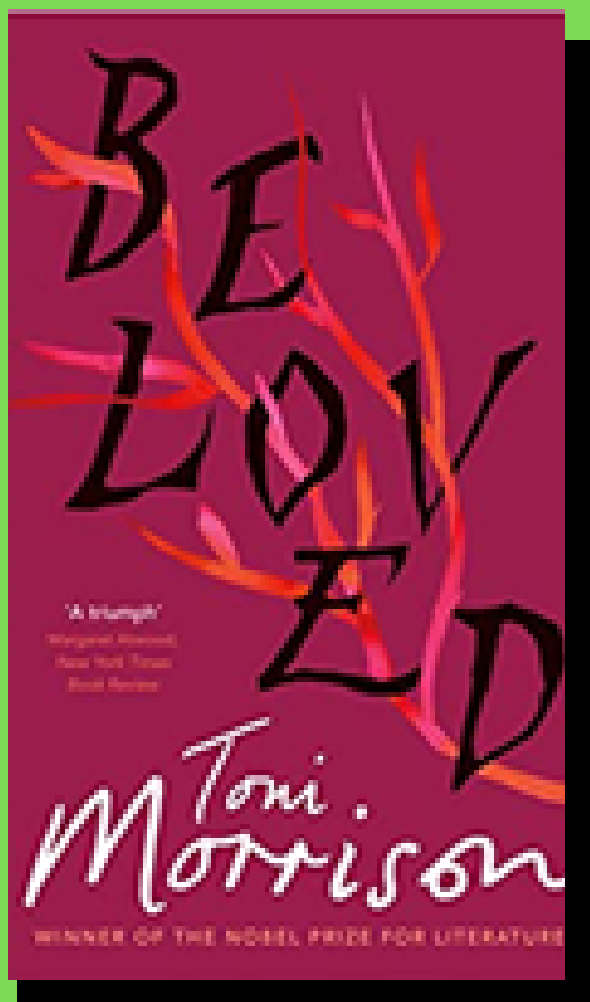
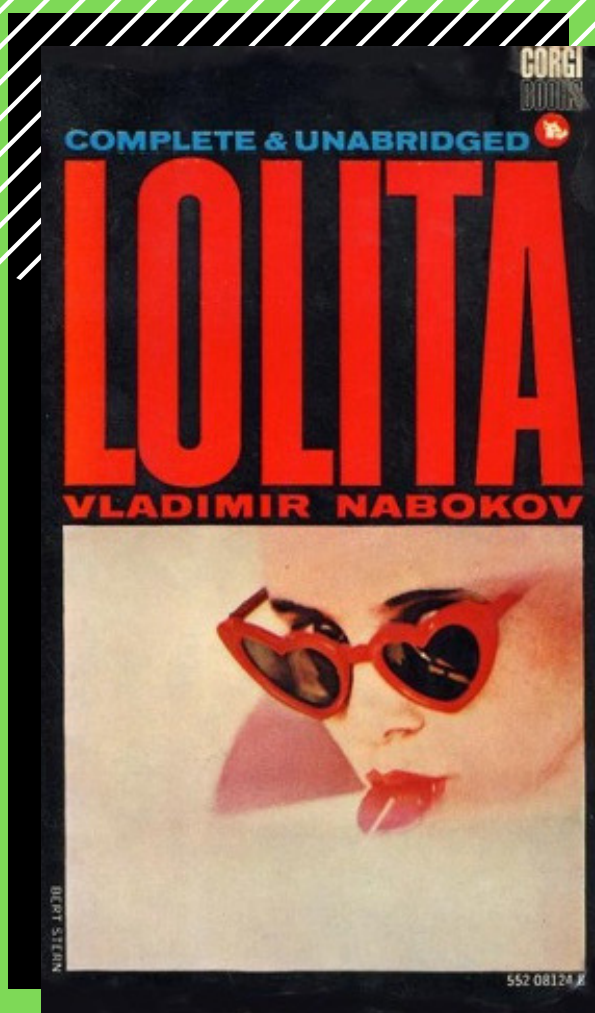
